HABITUAL ROBBERY SUSPECT SENTENCED TO 3 LIFE TERMS

In 2008 the Fort Lauderdale Police Department Violent Crimes Unit charged Breon Davis, B/M, 04/12/89 with multiple armed robberies. Davis was convicted and placed on felony probation.

While on probation, Davis committed an additional armed robbery on May 21, 2011 and was charged accordingly. As a result, Davis was adjudicated as a Career Offender and remained in the custody of Broward Sheriff's Office, Main Jail, until being released on May 8, 2012. Davis' conditions for release were probation and a curfew of 10:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M.

On July 19, 2012, Fort Lauderdale Police Career Criminal Unit Detectives and Probation Officers conducted a random curfew check at Davis' residence and he was not home. Probation obtained a Violation of Probation warrant for Davis and the Career Criminal Unit issued a BOLO (Be On the Look Out) to road patrol officers.

On July 29, 2012, a Fort Lauderdale Police Officer responded to the 2600 block of South Federal Highway for a disturbance. This officer recognized Davis from the issued BOLO. Davis attempted to evade being identified and provided the officer with a false name. The officer utilized a Department-issued fingerprint scanner and positively identified Davis. Davis was taken into custody for the Violation of Probation warrants and providing a false name to a law enforcement officer.

On August 29, 2013, Davis attended a sentencing hearing before the Honorable Judge Backman. During this hearing, Davis rejected a plea deal offering him a prison sentence of (15) fifteen years. Judge Backman ultimately sentenced Davis to (3) three life terms in prison.
