LAUDERDALE MARATHON

The 13.1 Michelob Ultra Fort Lauderdale Marathon returns to the City of Fort Lauderdale on Sunday, November 15th. Motorists are encouraged to carefully review the listed road closures and should expect traffic delays from 6:30 A.M. until approximately 11:00 A.M.

The actual race is tentatively scheduled to begin at 6:30 A.M. Race organizers are expecting approximately 3,000 participants at this year's event.

Street Closures and Detours for Sunday, November 9th:

- **6:30 A.M. to 7:00 A.M.:**
 - Southbound lanes of Federal Highway will be closed from Southeast 1st Street to Ponce de Leon Drive.
- **6:30 A.M. to 7:30 A.M.:**
 - Eastbound, Northbound and Westbound lanes of Southeast 9th Avenue, Southeast 11th Court, Cordova Road and Southeast 7th Street will be closed from Ponce de Leon Drive to North Rio Vista Boulevard.
- **6:40 A.M. to 7:45 A.M.:**
 - Northbound lane of Southeast 3rd Avenue Bridge and Andrews Avenue Bridge will be closed from Southeast 6th Street to East Las Olas Boulevard.
- **6:45 A.M. to 8:30 A.M.:**
 - Eastbound lanes of East Las Olas Boulevard will be closed from South Federal Highway to State Road A1A.
 - Southbound, Eastbound and Northbound lanes of New River Drive (Southeast 5th Avenue) will be closed from Southeast 1st Avenue to Southeast 5th Avenue.
- **6:45 A.M. to 11:00 A.M.:**
 - Northbound lanes of State Road A1A will be closed from Southeast 5th Street to Northeast 25th Street.

Event organizers have placed message signboards throughout the race route providing ample time for motorists to prepare for the above closures.
