FUGITIVE IN CUSTODY
AFTER
23 YEARS

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department has arrested Tidorange Noel in connection with the 1985 double homicide of Immacula Herme and Clement Fatal. Noel is facing two additional charges of Attempted Murder of Noel's ex-girlfriend, Agnes Atis and Frangilus Munice.

Through the persistent efforts of the Fort Lauderdale homicide unit, Fort Lauderdale fugitive unit, the FBI Fugitive Task Force, Royal Bahamas Police Force- Central Detective Unit, and (ICE), U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Noel will face charges of 2 Counts of First Degree Murder and 2 Counts of Attempted First Degree Murder.

"This alleged murderer, who has been a fugitive for 23 years, will now have to account for his actions," said Anthony Mangione, special agent in charge of the ICE Office of Investigations in Miami. "We are glad that we were able to provide assistance to our law enforcement partners at the Fort Lauderdale Police Department and will continue to partner with other law enforcement agencies to identify, locate and capture individuals who pose a threat to public safety."

On February 12, 1985, Noel entered the residence of his ex-girlfriend Agnes Atis and began firing rounds. Atis was able to get away and hide, however Noel subsequently shot and killed Immacula Herme and Clement Fatal. He also shot Frangilus Munice who eventually recovered from him injuries. Noel fled the scene was not located.

Detectives received information throughout the years that Noel was living in The Bahamas under an assumed name. Several requests were made though the Royal Bahamas Police Force, (RBPF), to locate Noel but they were unsuccessful. In December of 2007, detectives again requested the RBPF

attempt to locate Noel since they had reason to believe he had been recently arrested. With the assistance of ICE, Noel was positively identified as the man in

jail known to them as "Fred Tador". Fred Tador and Tidorange Noel were one and the same.

After a lengthy process, with the assistance of multiple agencies, Tidorange Noel was brought back to South Florida on Tuesday, July 8, 2008 at 3:15pm.
