ROBBERY OF COCA-COLA DELIVERYMAN

(** Suspect in Custody)

ORIGINAL RELEASE:

On June 10, 2008 at approximately 5:30pm, a deliveryman for Coca-Cola was robbed and injured while dropping off soda at the Sistrunk Market located at 1500 NW 6th Street.

According to detectives, the victim was finished delivering soda when he saw two suspicious looking males approach him in the parking lot near his truck. The victim felt there was trouble afoot and decided to go back into the store. The two criminals then assaulted the victim and robbed him of his wallet and cash proceeds from the day's work. The two suspects fled the scene on foot and were not identified or located at that time. The victim sustained significant injuries to his leg and ankle area.

Detectives have identified two suspects in connection with this robbery. 15 year-old Antwon Q. Boyd and 22 year-old Kelvin L. Jackson were positively identified by the victim and witnesses as the two responsible for the robbery. Less than three days after the incident, Antwon Q. Boyd was apprehended and charged with Strong Armed Robbery and Aggravated Battery.

UPDATE:

Fort Lauderdale Fugitive Task Force Detective Chuck Morrow was assigned to track down both Antwon Q. Boyd and Kelvin L. Jackson, who were hiding out from police due to warrants for Robbery and Aggravated Battery.

Through the years, Detective Morrow has built a professional rapport with the Boyd and Jackson family. With their assistance, the family convinced Boyd to surrender himself to the detective on June 13, 2008.

The second suspect, Kelvin L. Jackson, remained at large and was on the run. On June 19, 2008, a press release was issued to the media and Broward County Crime Stoppers offered a reward of up to \$1,000 for information leading to the location and arrest of Kelvin L. Jackson.

Later that day and into the morning, Detective Morrow received information that although Jackson had been hiding out in North Lauderdale, he was back in the area of the 600 block of NW 15th Avenue. This information was attributed to the local media coverage, Broward Crime Stoppers tips and the family members who trusted and had confidence in Detective Morrow.

At approximately 3:50am today, Detective Morrow located and arrested Jackson who was standing among a group of males. He was taken into custody without incident and booked at FLPD.
