The Fort Lauderdale Police Department invites the public and the media to join us in congratulating the following officers on their recent promotion.

Assistant Chief: Karen Dietrich

Karen Dietrich has served the Fort Lauderdale Police Department since 1990. Karen has been assigned to the Operations Bureau in the Patrol Division, Special Problems Unit, Motor Unit and in the Criminal Investigations Division as a Detective. She was the first female motorcycle officer to be assigned to the Motor Unit from 1995 to 2000. Karen served as a member of the Honor Guard in 1993 and the SWAT team in 1994. She served as a Sergeant in the Operations Bureau and the Training Unit, and then as a Lieutenant in the Criminal Investigations Division. As a Captain, Karen was assigned to the Operations Division as a District Shift Supervisor, the FTO Commander and the Executive Officer to the District Major. She also served as a Captain in the Special Operations Division, Support Services Bureau, and the Investigations Bureau. As a Major, Karen was assigned to the Office of Internal Affairs, Criminal Investigations Division, and most recently the Administrative Support Division. Karen holds a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration from Union Institute and University and a Master's Degree in Strategic Leadership from Mountain State University. Karen is a graduate from The Southern Police Institute Command Officer's Development Course, The Southern Police Institute Executive Leadership Program and the Federal Bureau of Investigations National Academy, Class 262. Karen is the recipient of 22 Departmental Commendations, 39 Public Commendations and 2 Life Saving Awards. Karen is the first female to serve at the rank of Assistant Chief for the Fort Lauderdale Police Department in over a decade.

Major: Francis Sousa

Francis Sousa has served the Fort Lauderdale Police Department since 1999. Francis has been assigned to the Operations Bureau in the Patrol Division, Tactical Impact Unit, and the Special Investigations Division as a Task Force Officer with the Drug Enforcement Administration. He served as a Sergeant in the Office of the Chief as the Public Information Officer and with the Operations Bureau in the Patrol Division. Frank also served as a Lieutenant in the Administrative Support Division and Criminal Investigations Division. Captain: Steven Greenlaw

Steve Greenlaw has served the Fort Lauderdale Police Department since 2003. Steve has been assigned to the Operations Division, Special Investigations Division and Criminal Investigations Division. He served as a Sergeant in the Operations Division and the Special Investigations Division. Prior to being promoted to the rank of Captain, he served as a Lieutenant in the Operations Bureau in the Patrol Division and as the Logistics Lieutenant in the Support Services Bureau. He has served on the Department's Special Weapons and Tactics Team (SWAT) for the last (14) years and has been the SWAT Commander for the last (2) years. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Human Resource Management from Florida State University and is currently enrolled in the National Tactical Association's Command College.
