**RING CAMERA CAPTURES
TWO SEPARATE
BURGLARY INCIDENTS**

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department is investigating two separate residential burglary incidents that occurred at a South Middle River home near Northwest 7th Avenue and Northwest 11th Street. Both incidents were captured by the homeowner's Ring doorbell camera and posted to the Neighbors application.

The first burglary was Friday, January 11th at approximately 7:45 A.M. The video shows a black male entering the resident's back yard. Due to the real-time motion alert from the Ring camera, the homeowner was notified and called 9-1-1. Responding officers were unable to locate the suspect in this incident.

The suspect can be seen wearing white gloves, distinct shoes (possibly Yeezy's) and a Florida State Seminoles sweatshirt. Detectives are encouraging anyone with information regarding his identity to contact Detective T. Taylor at 954-828-6673.

The second burglary was Tuesday, January 15th at approximately 12:53 P.M. In this incident, the video shows two black males in the resident's back yard successfully entering a storage shed. This time, once the homeowner called 9-1-1, Fort Lauderdale Police officers quickly arrived in the area and within minutes, took the two suspects into custody.

The suspects in the second burglary have been identified as:

- David Belim, B/M, 8/29/01, a resident of the City of Fort Lauderdale.
- Ken Nixon, B/M, 11/01/02, a resident of the City of Lauderhill.

Both of the above suspects have been charged with burglary, a second degree felony.
