Captain David Cortes

David Cortes joined the Fort Lauderdale Police Department in 1999. He began his career serving in the Operations Bureau as a patrol officer and a field training officer. David also served as a street level narcotics detective assigned to the Investigations Bureau. Upon being promoted to the rank of sergeant, David served as patrol supervisor, street crimes sergeant in the Special Investigations Division, a detective sergeant in the Office of Internal Affairs and as the sergeant of the Drug Enforcement and Vice Unit. He was also a member and team leader on the agency's

SWAT Team. As a lieutenant, David again served in the Operations Bureau as a shift commander before transferring to the Support Services Bureau's Logistics position. His most recent assignment was in the Chief's Office as the Internal Affairs lieutenant. David holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice management from Union Institute and University. He is the recipient of two Officer of the Month awards, nine public commendations and 24 departmental commendations.



Captain Kimberly Maus

Kimberly Maus began her law enforcement career in 1990 as a constable with the City of Cambridge Massachusetts Police Department and was hired by the Fort Lauderdale Police Department in October of 1993.
