**COMP USA BURGLARY**

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department is investigating a burglary that occurred at approximately 06:00 A.M. this morning. The burglary occurred at 1740 North Federal Highway, Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Preliminary investigation has revealed that an on-duty officer, who was across the street, heard a loud noise coming from the 1700 block of North Federal Highway. As the officer went to investigate, he observed a Chevy Tahoe exit from the Comp USA Parking lot with a chain attached to the back of the vehicle. The vehicle began to drive southbound in the northbound lanes of Federal Highway. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle but was unable to do so.

At approximately 6:02 A.M., the police department received an alarm from the Comp USA. While responding to this alarm another call was received by police dispatch advising that there was a weapons complaint in the 1200 block Southeast 2 Court. The complainant advised that three black males were to the rear of her residence with gloves on. Police established a perimeter in the area. Fort Lauderdale Police K-9 and other officers were able to locate three males along with the Tahoe. The three males were taken into custody. A portion of the stolen material from Comp USA was recovered inside of the vehicle.

The subjects that are in custody are Noah Jean, B/M, 10/27/1988, Lenelle Lebrun, B/M, 10/16/1988, and Journal Louis, B/M, 10/12/1984. All three subjects reside in Miami, Florida. The three culprits are currently at the police department where charges are forthcoming.

There is video available and the detectives are awaiting a representative from Comp USA to take possession of the video. As soon as the video becomes available it will be released to the media. The information that we have received thus far indicates that there are one or two more sedans that were involved and several more culprits.
